Since 1998, our partners, donors, and sponsors have generously provided financial and moral support while we have continued to develop programs to meet the unmet needs of the Greater Cincinnati and Northern Kentucky's less fortunate women and children.

The economic impact of the pandemic and other economic issues in our area has resulted in a major increase in the needs of our partners.

Our largest program, Operation School Bell, distributed more than 47,000 more items of clothing than in the prior year, a 100% increase. We added four schools to the program this year and now have a waiting list of four additional schools who need uniform style clothing and hygiene items for their students. We have promised help to these new schools as we secure additional funding.

The ALCares4Kids program added a new partner this year, which expanded our reach into Mainville, Ohio. This program now provides clothing to children in Hamilton, Warren, Butler, and Brown Counties. We provided over 11,000 articles of clothing, including diapers, to these partners. This also represents more than a 100% increase from the prior year. Our other three programs also grew by over 50% in distributed products.

As our population was recovering financially from the pandemic, we decided to provide them with as much assistance as possible. To do this, we were required to pull funds from our financial reserves last year, when incoming donations did not meet our expectations. In 2023-2024 a major effort is being made to increase financial support from our current and new donors, so that we may continue our mission of providing clothing, household items, and school supplies.

Individual and corporate support are critical to our mission, and we thank you for all you have generously provided in prior years. We sincerely hope that you will continue that support in the future. In 2021-2022, \$.94 of every dollar received was spent on programs. In 2022-2023 we increased that number to \$.96. We take great pride in the fact that we are a 100% volunteer organization and make every effort to spend your dollars wisely.

OPERATION SCHOOL BELL® supplies new clothing, and hygiene supplies to students in 49 elementary schools.
“Because of Assistance League, our students have comfort and dignity in their appearance.”

AL® CARES 4 KIDS (formerly Kinship Foster Care) supplies diapers, hygiene items, underwear and socks, to children in foster care, kinship care, or are homeless.
“Most of our foster and kinship families would not be able to afford new underwear & socks, so would go without.”

NEW BEGINNINGS/DOMESTIC VIOLENCE provides a collection of essential household supplies and hygiene items, to families when they transition from one of the 7 local domestic violence shelters, to set up their new lives.
“Our clients are overjoyed, with these supplies, as it gives them comfort in knowing people do care about them, and support their ability to be independent in starting a new life.”

ASSAULT SURVIVOR KITS® include new clothes and toiletries, delivered to over 27 Cincinnati area hospitals for survivors of sexual assault.
“As most of our clients hand over clothing to the police, the Assistance League clothing allows our survivors to leave the hospital in comfort, without others bringing clothes to them.”

COLLEGE STARTER KITS are a collection of study supplies, given to adult students enrolled at two local colleges, for further education.

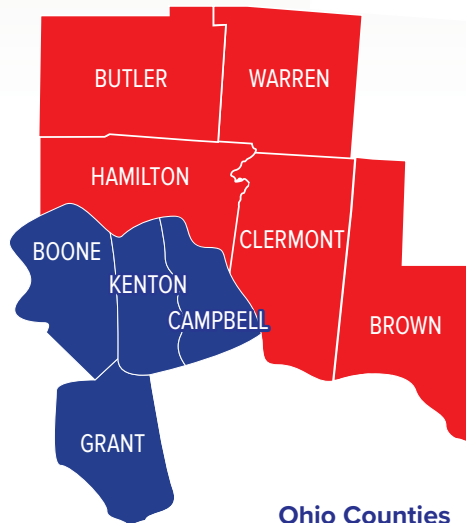

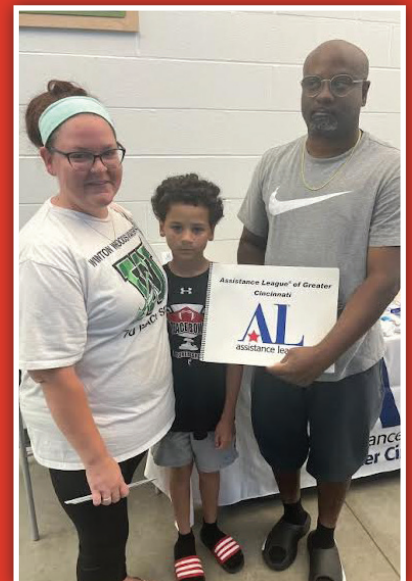
